CHAPTER 81.

An act to amend sections two, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, twelve and one-half, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, seventeen, eighteen and twenty of an act entitled "An act to regulate the examination of applicants for license, and the practice of those licensed, to treat diseases, injuries, deformities, or other physical or mental conditions of human beings; to establish a board of medical examiners, to provide for their appointment and prescribe their powers and duties,

**Public Drinking Cups and Towels Opposed by Senate**

By a vote of 30 to 4, the senate yesterday passed Assemblyman Lee Gebhart's bill providing for the licensing and examination of midwives by the state board of medical examiners. Senator Herbert Jones, championed the measure in the upper house.

Senator Stuckenbruck's attempt to introduce an amendment, which would allow physicians from out of the state to secure a license to practice in California on the showing that they had practiced a year in another state, was voted down, only eight senators favoring it.

Two bills by Senator Jones, prohibiting the use of common drinking cups and towels in public places, were passed, although both received opposition. The opposition was chiefly on the ground that the bills made no provision for replacing the prohibited articles with substitutes.

Senator Irwin's attempt to amend the bill affecting towels to exclude factories was voted down by a vote of 11 for and 19 against. The final vote, which passed the bill, was 25 to 9. The vote on the drinking cup bill was 26 to 6.
